The International Friendship Program (IFP) was brought to our attention during Moments for Ministry on June 20, 2004, by Heather Day from the Office of International Students & Scholars at Purdue University. There are 1000 NEW international students coming to Purdue in the fall of 2004. There are a total of over 5000 international students that attend Purdue, representing almost any country you can think of. The IFP program helps to find people in the community to match up with the international students and befriend them. The students are ages 22 all the way up to an 84 year old woman one time! :) Heather told a fun story about one couple who requested a student from Romania. They had one Romanian student and gave her to the couple. Things worked out very well and they developed a very close relationship. Even now the girl will be housesitting for the couple while they visit Romania.

We ask that you meet with the student at least once a month. Students are very busy. They have to succeed at Purdue---they have sacrificed a lot to be here. They enjoy simple family dinners, outings, and especially like to join in on holidays. They enjoy the warmth of a real home since they are missing theirs. You get back as much as you give. If you have children in your home it's good for them to know people from other countries. The students are excellent role models. Those who sign up for interest in the program will attend a one hour

orientation meeting. In that one hour you will find out what to do and if you want to sign up to host a student. Decide male or female student, what country, and either single or a family.

There are no legal, financial or housing obligations. The only requirement is the willingness to befriend a student interested in meeting you! ROUNDING UP THE BARNS: NOW & THEN

Many of you have seen the round barn that was built last year (2003) on State Road 25, near the turn off to Buck Creek (450 North). People marveled as the barn took shape---who would build a new round barn in this day and age?

In answer to that question, Peg Eckhart has provided some facts on and photos of the new barn. (Both outside and inside views are below!!)

It sets on Wandering Acres LLC and the owners are Wanda & Dennis Owen. It boasts 3 stories with an observation deck on the 3rd level. Diameter of the barn is 104 feet. The height to the top of the cupola is 50 feet. Circumference of the barn is 326.7 feet. It is designed for 18 stalls with doors that swing open for easy cleaning. The track is 14 feet wide, made of 30,000 pounds of ground-up tires, 4 inches thick. 16.2 laps around equals 1 mile. The hayloft is 2659 square feet, for hay bale storage. There is a climatic controlled office, bathroom and tack room. And how many windows?? Where do you start counting---there are 62! (That would make a great local trivia question.) 

At one time there were almost 200 round barns in Indiana. One of the closest to our area was at 400 North and 500 East, southwest of Buck Creek. Built around 1912, and much smaller than the new round barn, it fell or was torn down around 1972. Lloyd & Wilma Frazier lived on that farm during the 1950's & 60's [see photo, circa 1954]. Today there are approximately 96 older round barns still standing in Indiana. Three



close to our area are located: southeast of Camden on Carroll Co. Rd. 300 N (1910); west of Delphi in Carroll Co., Tippecanoe Twp., IN 18 W (1911); and south of Mulberry on Clinton Co. Rd. 900W (1912).



RECIPE CORNER

MELINDA'S VANILLA CREAM PIE

- 2 C sugar
- 5 Tbsn cornstarch
- 1 pint half-and-half
- 1/2 C butter or margarine
- 1 Pint whipping cream
- 2 (8inch) pie shells, unbaked
- 1 tspn vanilla
- cinnamon or nutmeg

Place sugar and cornstarch in bowl. Add enough half-n-half to moisten sugar; stir well. In seperate bowl, melt butter. Add remaining half-n-half and whipping cream; add sugar mixture. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until thicken ed. Pour into unbaked pie shells. Sprinkle in vanilla on top of pie. Sprinkle with cinnamon or nutmeg. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-25 minutes.
