

FIREFIGHTERS HONORED

Many local volunteer firefighters and their families were with us for worship services on Sunday, November 6th, 2005, as we honored them for what they do for our community. Lay leader Ralph Rohrer let the firefighters know how much we appreciate them. He & wife Mindy live next door to 2 firefighter families, and have first hand experience of how great the volunteers are. Last winter when they woke up to the smell of what could have been mistaken for burnt toast *sniff* *sniff* or marshmallows, they found a smoke filled room! Ralph said that it seemed like 5 seconds and Bob was there, and 2 seconds later, Ron appeared after Ralph made the call for help. Ralph reminded us that the firefighters ofttimes have to get up in the middle of the night from a warm bed to go and face who knows what-- it could be a fire, a rescue mission, or someone taking their last breath, or a scene of carnage. Sometimes they recognize a car that's been in a smash-up. It takes courage to go the first time, and remarkable courage the 2nd, 3rd, 4th... times. All of us are grateful for what the firefighters do.

Ralph introduced Fire chief Ed Spitznagle who thanked us for inviting them and told us currently there are 33 active/honorary volunteers. He read their names aloud, and 18 were present w/their families today. Also honored were Township trustee Angie Austin, and Township board members Jim Davidson Jr., Steve Mitchell, and Sandy

CATCHING UP WITH PAST PASTORS #2

REV. DR. R. CLAYTON KENDALL (pastor at BCUMC 1977-1995)

Thank you for your request to share an up-date of my activities. I am in my twelfth year of being retired and it is amazing how active I remain. It is that way because of the new adventure I started over ten years ago when, at the request of several persons, I started St. Paul's Community Church in Linden. We recently had a fantastic gathering to assess and attempt to comprehend all that we have accomplished in those years. This has been a most enjoyable venture and one that I wish I had started when I was much younger and had more stamina. Nevertheless, God supplies the necessary strength and we have a happy and productive family of God at St. Paul Church. It took us three hours to attempt to put it all together when we had our celebration.

As you may or may not know, Mary Hollis is my assistant Pastor and does her fair share of preaching and visiting. Each week we are quite involved in efforts to reach out to persons who are otherwise ignored. What blessings we have received as we have gone forth to witness. We conduct sessions of Bible study and have developed a great program of study for the adults during our Sunday School our. We have initiated many programs of supplying food and other needs for the needy. We apply many hundreds of dollars to those needs each year.

We also have supported a missionary in France for a period of three years, and we are presently putting our missionary efforts toward a lady in India who has a Bible College (25 years now) in Nagaland. We were fortunate to have had her present with St. Paul Church for several days and received a real blessing in the time with her. We continue to support her and the work and have helped them finally get a well for the first time along with the erection of two new houses for the students. We continue to support this work with great enthusiasm.

God only knows how long I will be able to continue at this pace, but I am feeling great and have great enthusiasm in my ministry. On December 1st as many of you will remember, I will be celebrating my 77th birthday. Mom tells me that she and I are the "old ones" of our family. I remember vividly how I announced one day at Buck Creek that I had at that time attained the speed limit in age: 55 years! Where does the time go? Mom will be 96 in January and still lives by herself. I am so thankful for her wonderful presence.

Leah and I will celebrate our 58th anniversary next July and I am now in my Fifty-eighth year of preaching. I still read and study each day. I have written many new poems since my Buck Creek days, and I have plans for more writing starting with the new year.

As a church we are experiencing many great moments together. From year one, we have had many persons reading through the Bible and this year will be no different. There will be between 12 and 15 persons who will complete the yearly Bible reading. We are so thankful that we started the St. Paul Church and we are looking forward to more exciting spiritual moments.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DWIGHT

I had originally planned to give the second part of being a member of BCUMC, but Nancy Schnepp reminded me that this would be the Advent newsletter and as I prayed God has lead me to give some background on the Advent wreath that will be a part of our worship service in this Christmas season. I pray that this will enrich your worship of God as you meditate on this symbol of Christmas.

First, the wreath is always in the form of a circle. Since a circle has no beginning and no end, it is a symbol for God, Who is eternal and without beginning or end.

The Advent wreath is always made from evergreens. Since they are ever green, they are symbolic of Christ, Who died, but Who is alive. The evergreen branches also symbolize our soul's immortality. Christ came into the world to give us life eternal.

The wreath has four candles. These symbolize the four weeks of the Advent season, our time of preparation for Christmas. Every week of Advent another candle is lit. As the light from the wreath increases each week as more candles are lit, the wreath reminds us that the birth of the Light of the World is coming closer. There is a fifth candle in the center which is lit on Christmas eve or Christmas day, called the Christ candle, representing the birth of our Lord and Savior.

The candles can come in different colors. The Roman Catholic tradition uses 3 purple which stand for prayer and penitence and one rose candle which stands for joy. The Reformed tradition often uses four blue candles which stand for the royalty of Christ. Sometimes four red or four white are also used.

The wreath most probably came from pagan Germanic rites of the early middle ages. In seeking the coming of the Sun they would light candles to prepare for the longer days. As Christians light the Advent candles, we look forward to the coming of the Son of God. Some have traced the wreath's Christian roots to St. Boniface in the ninth century. It is said that he took a pagan symbol and redeemed it by using it to point to the birth of Christ.

This Advent season we will be focusing on "light" as it relates to Jesus and our daily walk with Him. I pray that we will grow closer to the Light as He penetrates the darkness of our lives with his love and grace. "In him was life, and that life was the light of men." John 1:4

RECIPE CORNER

"And this is His command: to believe in the name of His Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as He commanded us." -1 John 3:23

E-Z PEANUT BUTTER FUDGE

This was my mom Ella Mae's favorite fudge. Keep it cool, and be warned that one piece leads to another... and another... and...

- 1 box light brown sugar
- 2 cups white sugar
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 4 Tablespoons cornstarch (level)
- 1 small jar smooth (or crunchy) peanut butter (12 oz.)
- 1 stick butter (or margarine)
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- pinch of cream of tartar



Mix first 4 items (sugars, milk, cornstarch) to cook to soft ball stage (232 degrees). Remove from heat. Add remaining ingredients. Beat a short time (not very long like with chocolate fudge). Pour into buttered pan. Cool. Cut into squares. (This makes a 13 x 9 pan full.) Great for Christmas giving.
