


NEW GRANDSON!

TIME CAPSULE: 1909

The current Buck Creek UMC building was dedicated on January 31, 1909, having been built during 1908. Recently a pristine postcard surfaced of the church, marked 1908-1909 on the back. It was found "among Harold Archer's mother's things", Suzann Brouwer was told when it was given to her. Suzann passed it on to Nancy Schnepp who shared it with Buck Creek historian Peg Eckhart. Peg said that she did not have such a good quality photo as this one from that time period. Retta Whiteaker remembers "Harold Archer's mother"

as being Clara Archer, who was a neighbor when Retta was growing up.


Check out the scenery on the north side (left) and you'll see there is no school building at that time (there was a school but in a different

RECIPE CORNER

Where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of Heaven and Earth. –Psalm 121:1-8

Snowed in and find you have run out of Bisquick or Hungry Jack mix (for pancakes) or maple syrup? Don't call 9-1-1, we'll rescue you with these emergency recipes!

EMERGENCY BUTTERMILK PANCAKES

3 cups flour 3 cups buttermilk (or regular milk 3 T. white sugar w/ 1 T. vinegar per cup milk)

3 tsp. baking powder 1/2 c. milk 1 1/2 tsp. baking soda 3 eggs

3/4 tsp. salt 1/3 c. butter, melted

Mix dry ingredients together. Mix wet ingredients together. Do not mix dry and wet together until ready to use.

HOMEMADE SYRUP

1 cup white sugar

1 cup brown sugar

1 cup water

1/2 tsp. maple or vanilla syrup flavoring

3 T. butter or margarine

Bring to boil first four ingredients and cook for 5 minutes. Then stir in margarine to melt. Pour syrup over pancakes. Serve warm!


